	During this introductory session, Orna will provide participants with background information about the historical development of ODR. She will discuss how ODR applies not only to disputes that arise from online transactions, but to offline disputes as well. Orna will also present the strengths and limits of ODR as well as how ODR is supporting a shift from dispute resolution to dispute prevention.

During this session, Graham will define and clarify the scope of ODR, reviewing the journey of ODR from online ADR to online courts. He will also outline the benefits ODR can bring to a justice system for citizens, lawyers, judges, and the courts.

#### 11:30 Session 1: Overview of ODR in Europe (Continued)

Graham Ross, UK Lawyer/Mediator, Expert Advisor and Trainer in ODR

In continuing this session, Graham will provide a review of ODR in Europe both as developments in actual operational services as well as a key element in developments in European Union consumer law. This will include presenting drawbacks in EU consumer law related ODR and suggestions how non-EU countries can learn the lessons to improve and gain 'second adopter' benefit, i.e., how online ADR for consumer disputes can reduce the burden of court issued consumer claims. Graham will also cover the Council of Europe's Resolution on ODR in the context of Article 6 of the European Convention of Human Rights (Access to Justice) and outline the journey to online courts in the UK, including hurdles and criticisms raised regarding online courts and how they were responded to.

#### 12:30 Session 2: ODR in Practice: Dutch Legal Aid Board – *Rechtwijzer* Liselotte Maas, Team Leader, Dutch Legal Aid Board

This session will introduce participants to *Rechtwijzer*, an online dispute resolution tool resulting from a public-private partnership implemented by the Dutch Legal Aid Board aimed at enabling people to write their own marriage separation plan, with both optional and mandatory online support. *Rechtwijzer* received significant international acclaim and was nominated for the Crystal Scale of Justice in 2015. In her presentation, Liselotte will provide her unique perspectives on the development of *Rechtwijzer* and the overall use of ODR in the Netherlands.

### 14:00 Session 3: ODR in Practice: Civil Resolution Tribunal Shannon Salter, Chair, Civil Resolution Tribunal, Vancouver, British Columbia http://www.civilresolutionbc.ca

The Civil Resolution Tribunal (CRT) is Canada's first online tribunal, resolving neighbour and small claims disputes. Participants will learn how online dispute resolution can increase access to justice by building the justice system around the public, leveraging technology to connect people with legal help wherever and whenever it's convenient for them. During this session, Shannon will introduce the CRT model and discuss the changing role of lawyers in a digital age.

Participants will learn about what worked, what didn't work as well as best practices in developing an ODR system.

## SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

### **ORNA RABINOVICH-EINY**

Orna Rabinovich-Einy is a Senior Lecturer at the Faculty of Law at the University of Haifa. Her areas of expertise are alternative dispute resolution (ADR), online dispute resolution (ODR), and civil procedure, with research focusing on the relationship between formal and informal justice systems, dispute resolution system design and the impact of technology on dispute resolution. Orna is a fellow of the Haifa Forum of Law and Society, the Haifa Center for Law and Technology, and the Center for Information Technology and Dispute Resolution at UMass, Amherst. Orna holds a doctorate in Law (J.S.D.) degree from Columbia University. She was admitted to the Bar in Israel and in New York, and was certified as a mediator in New York by the Safe Horizon Mediation Center.

## **GRAHAM ROSS**

Graham Ross is a UK lawyer and shareholder mediator who helped pioneer the development of Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) with particular reference to online mediation since 2001. Graham cofounded the UK's first ODR service, We Can Settle, in 2000 (a blind bidding system), and the online mediation service The Mediation Room. Conducted ODR pilots for PayPal, and for two Small Claims Courts. He is a fellow of the National Center of Technology and Dispute Resolution (NCTDR) at the University of Massachusetts and member of the ODR Advisory Group appointed by the UK Civil Justice Council. Advised on ODR to court services in the UK, Bulgaria, and Canada, and the EU. Member of the United Nations Expert Panel on Online Dispute Resolution. Graham advises Modria, the recognized global leaders in the field. He is a member of the EU funded EMCOD project which has developed an online tool for the measurement of justice through ODR and is helping develop ODR standards for the International Mediation Institute. Graham is lead tutor at www.ODRtraining.com) as well as for individual mediators in over 20 countries. He delivered training





for the Milan Chamber of Arbitration and for the UK Ministry of Justice.

## LISELOTTE MAAS

Liselotte Mass is an expert in ODR in the Netherlands. Liselotte is a project leader at the Legal Aid Board, which designed and implemented *Rechtwijzer*, an online dispute resolution tool built on a public-private partnership aimed at enabling people to write their own separation plan, with both optional and mandatory online support. *Rechtwijzer* received significant international acclaim and was nominated for the Crystal Scale of Justice in 2015. She currently leads a team in implementation of the Debt Rescheduling Natural Persons Law.

## SHANNON SALTER

Shannon Salter is an expert in online dispute resolution and administrative law with over 10 years of experience. Shannon is Chair at Civil Resolution Tribunal in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The Civil Resolution Tribunal (CRT) is one of the first online tribunals in the world, which resolves strata (condominium) and small claims disputes, encouraging collaborative dispute resolution, and making binding decisions when people can't agree. She is responsible for all aspects of implementing and operating this innovative, multi-million dollar access to justice project, including supervising over 40 staff and tribunal members, adjudicating claims, designing online technology processes, collaborating with software developers, engaging government and stakeholders, drafting rules, establishing adjudicative and access to justice best practices, budgeting, and performance reporting. Shannon is the Commissioner of the Financial Institutions Commission, vice president of the BC Council of Administrative Tribunals, and a board member of the Canadian Legal Information Institute (CanLII). She was named one of Canada's New Law Pioneers by the Canadian Bar Association and an Access to Justice All-Star by the National Self-Represented Litigants Project (NSRLP) in 2016. Shannon is a frequent speaker at international conferences on online dispute resolution, administrative law, legal education, and the future of

law and technology.
